

A new station at Williams Landing.

The State Government has allocated a total of \$220 million for new stations to be delivered in the growth areas of Lynbrook, Caroline Springs, Cardinia Road in Pakenham and Williams Landing.

Project overview

The new station at Williams Landing is part of the Government's plan to improve Melbourne's public transport network. The station will service a population that is expected to double in the next 20 years to 96,000 people, with the development of the new Williams Landing town centre to the north of the station.

Building a new station at Williams Landing is an important, practical step to serve this growing community. The station will serve current and future public transport needs and help people access jobs, study and entertainment.

Project features

The project includes the construction of a new train station next to the Palmers Road Bridge. The south side of the site is bordered by the Princes Freeway.

The new Williams Landing Station will be located on the Werribee Line.

Features of the station include:

- an island style platform between the existing passenger rail lines
- a new bus terminal and a taxi rank
- a park and ride facility with approximately 500 spaces
- closed circuit camera security surveillance (CCTV)
- pedestrian access across the rail line and Princes Freeway via a footbridge
- facilities for cyclists, including bike cages.

Williams Landing Station has been designed to comply with Disability Discrimination Act requirements.

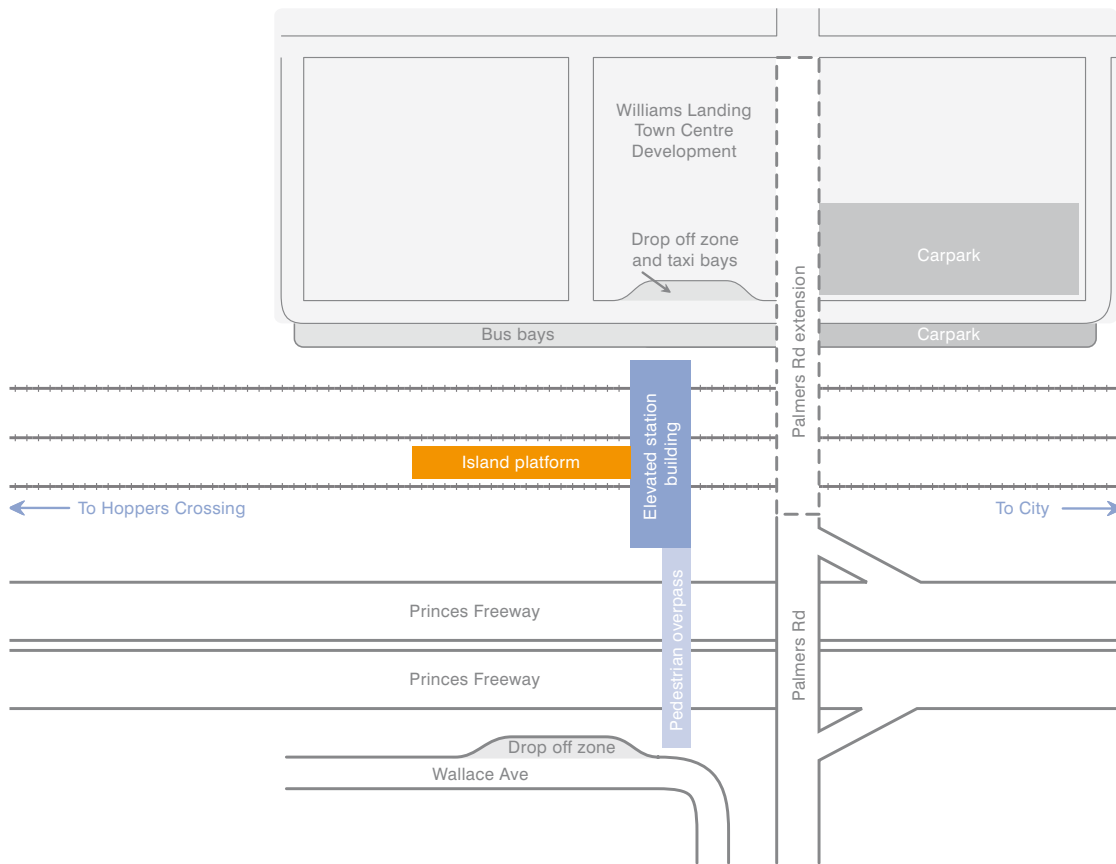
Palmers Road extension

Local residents will benefit from a \$24 million extension of Palmers Road. The overpass will extend across the rail line to provide direct access to Williams Landing town centre and the new station.

Project timing

Construction will start in 2010 and be completed in late 2012. The Department of Transport is working in partnership with VicRoads and Metro to deliver this project.
